Guernsey Electricity name new engines after competition



The machines cost Guernsey Electricity £15 million

Guernsey Electricity has found names for their two new diesel engines, after opening a competition up to islanders.

The winning names are Trudy and Freddy, replacing their current names 2D and 3D.

More than 75 entries were received and judged by five panel members.

They thought the names were "a clever play on their original names and gave them a bit of a personality".

Mike Hamon won the competition and will switch the £15 million machines on at the end of April.



We also welcomed three new Forum members from Les Beaucamps High School. Charlotte, Brad and James were elected by their peers and will now ensure that the voice of all students from school are heard at Forum meetings.

More about the Youth Forum:

The Youth Forum is an elected body of young people that represents the voice of the Islands young people in decision making. The group is made up of 38 elected members who represent the Islands secondary schools, youth groups and uniformed youth provisions. The group meet
